This one-day course covers the terminology, concepts, and principles of legal issues that affect fire inspectors in the administration of their duties. This course will assist the fire inspector, or persons interested in said discipline in understanding the legal concepts related to the model fire codes.

The course will address the specific legal issues that fire inspectors face in carrying out their duties. The class will focus on administrative issues such as the permit, inspection, plan review and appeal processes as well as enforcement issues including stop work orders, notices of violation, and complaints. Writing administrative search warrants and legal issues and liability specific to fire inspectors will also be covered. Special topics including unsafe structures, rental inspection, hoarding and overcrowding will be discussed.
